"This is actually our first year

doing this," said Centralia Buchheit store manager John Hendrickson. "We have done several fundraising events with individual FFA chapters in the past, but nothing like this."

Enjoying a successful first year, Hendrickson explained throughout the month of March, FFA emblems were sold at the registers of the store, with all proceeds going to each of the four local chapters. Even more impressive, Hendrickson reported out of all eight Buchheit stores raising funds for the FFA, Centralia was the most substantial contributor.

"Throughout the month of March, we sold FFA emblems at the front registers. We offered a big yellow emblem for \$5, or a blue one for \$1," Hendrickson explained. "We collected a total of \$1,125 from
